What are Pedagogical Partnerships?

In a *Pedagogical*Partnership, Mary works
with a community of
learners to complete a
long-term Community of
Practice series over
several months on a
specific topic/area of
practice.

Each time you gather for a session, Mary facilitates you through a specific learning format:

- 1. Knowledge and Information Sharing
- 2. Stories that Inspire
 Deep Reflection
- 3. Practical Applications to Implement In-Between Sessions



Options for Pedagogical Partnerships:

Areas of Focus:

- Meeting up with Children's Emotions
- Children's Mental Health and Well-Being
- Educator Well-Being: Inside & Outside the Classroom
- Stepping into Leadership: A Series for New Leaders
- Nurturing Creativity: Bringing Back the Arts!
- Trauma-Informed Practice in ECE
- ...and, Mary also develops customized series' for communities!

Series Planning:

- 4-6 sessions a season (Spring/Fall/Winter)
- Typically, 1.5-2.5 hours in length each
- Group sizes with a *minimum* of 8 participants, and a *maximum* of 30 participants per cohort (multiple cohorts can run simultaneously)
- Round or U-shaped table arrangements to encourage collaboration
- In-person or virtual (in-person is encouraged where possible)
- To maximize the efficacy of the series, Pedagogical Partnerships require a strong commitment from communities and attendees

The Benefits of a Pedagogical Partnership:

- Increased *professional growth* in attendees
- A greater likelihood of cultivating long-term change
- Focuses on putting learning into practice, with follow-ups at each meeting
- Increased accountability from attendees
- Offers more opportunities to ask questions and reflect on practice over time, working out dilemmas as they arise
- Offers many opportunities to notice and celebrate shifts in practice within a highly supportive community!
